SPEAKER SEAH KIAN PENG REPRESENTS SINGAPORE AT 10TH G20 PARLIAMENTARY SPEAKERS' SUMMIT (P20) IN BRASILIA, BRAZIL, FROM 6 TO 8 NOVEMBER 2024

Speaker of Parliament, Mr Seah Kian Peng, is representing Singapore at the 10th G20 Parliamentary Speakers' Summit (P20) in Brazil from 6 to 8 November 2024, at the invitation of the host country, Brazil.

- Singapore is a guest country of this P20 hosted by the Brazilian Parliament (see "Background"). During the three-day Summit, Speaker Seah will be meeting and engaging with counterparts and parliamentarians from G20 members, invited countries, and international organisations.
- They will be sharing their legislative experiences and discussing possible strategies for inter-parliamentary cooperation in addressing global issues. In line with this year's theme of "Parliaments for a just world and a sustainable planet", they will focus on how parliaments of the world's largest economies can contribute towards fighting hunger, poverty and inequality, promoting socio-environmental development and a just and inclusive ecological transition, and building a global governance framework adapted to the challenges of the 21st century.
- During the Summit, Mr Seah will deliver speeches on the topics of "The contribution of parliaments to the fight against hunger, poverty, and equality" and "Parliaments in the construction of global governance adapted to the challenges of the 21st century". Additionally, Mr Seah may also hold bilateral meetings with his parliamentary counterparts.

Background

Hosted by the parliament of the country that holds the G20 presidency and with the support of the Inter-Parliamentary Union, the P20 brings together Speakers, Deputy Speakers, and other parliamentarians from the world's 21 major economies. The P20 is part of wider efforts to bring a parliamentary dimension to global governance, aimed at the raising of awareness and building political support for international commitments; and helping to translate these effectively into national realities.
