Tan Wu Meng, 40, is a doctor specialising in Medical Oncology and a Consultant at Parkway Cancer Centre. Wu Meng started his medical career at the Singapore General Hospital (SGH), specialising in Medical Oncology at the National Cancer Centre Singapore (NCCS) where he worked until early 2015.
