QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER

- *1. Mr. Koo Young: To ask the Minister for Education how many children were admitted to Primary I in 1965, giving figures separately for the four language streams and for government and aided schools.
- *2. Mr. Koo Young: To ask the Minister for Education in 1965 (a) whether there will be an increase or decrease in the number of classes from Primary I to VI in the Government and Aided English schools respectively, and what will be the actual number; (b) whether there will be an increase or decrease in the number of classes from Primary I to VI in the Government and Aided Chinese schools respectively, and what will be the actual number.
- *3. Mr. Koo Young: To ask the Minister for Education how many primary schools will the Government build or plan to build in 1965, and how many of them will be for the English stream, Chinese stream and Malay stream respectively.

QUESTIONS FOR WRITTEN ANSWER

1. Mr. Ong Eng Guan: To ask the Minister for Finance to state the number of Pioneer Certificates which have been issued to date, with details of name of firm; product specified; date of issue; time limit to commence operation, if any; whether and when the firm has commenced production; paid-up capital of the firm; percentage of local capital and foreign capital in the firm; and number of workmen of the firm.
2. Mr. Ong Eng Guan: To ask the Minister for Finance to state the expenditure incurred by the Government and the Economic Development Board to the latest available date on the Jurong Industrial Scheme.
3. Mr. Ong Eng Guan: To ask the Minister for Finance to state the number of factories which had commenced actual production in the Jurong industrial area by 31st October, 1964, giving name of firm; paid-up capital of the firm; number of workmen employed in the firm as at the latest available date; and percentage of local capital and foreign capital of the firm.
4. Mr. Ong Eng Guan: To ask the Minister for Finance to give a list of all industrial enterprises in Singapore established before 5th June, 1959, stating name of firm; products manufactured; and number of workmen employed.
