### **QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER\***

- \*1. Mr Mohd Ismail Hussein: To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance in light of the recent Auditor General's Report for FY 2014/2015 on lapses found in public sector entities (a) whether the respective Ministries have conducted their own investigations into the lapses; (b) whether these investigation reports will be made public; (c) how many of these lapses are repeat lapses; and (d) what are the measures the respective Ministries plan to take to tighten controls and avoid serious lapses that affect the proper use of public funds.
- \*2. Mr Png Eng Huat: To ask the Minister for Culture, Community and Youth in respect of the audit on the People's Association that is reported in the Report of the Auditor-General for FY2014/15 (a) what are the 13 businesses or services that have been given tenancy contracts totalling \$3.67 million without competition and what are the reasons given; and (b) what are the seven claims totalling \$114,767 made by the Chairman of the CCC to himself and what is the total amount of the three claims that have no supporting documents.
- \*3. **Mr Lim Biow Chuan:** To ask the Minister for Transport whether LTA has reviewed and approved the contingency plans by SMRT to provide alternative transport whenever there is a breakdown in the train services.
- \*4. **Ms Ellen Lee:** To ask the Minister for Defence (a) whether the SAF has provided adequate opportunities for women to participate and excel in their military careers; and (b) what is the impact of more SAF regular servicewomen on our national defence.

- \*5. Er Dr Lee Bee Wah: To ask the Minister for Social and Family Development in light of the recent case of unauthorised withdrawal of funds from the Child Development Account (CDA) (a) what is the Ministry doing to tighten control over the CDA; (b) how will the Ministry assist parents to trace the transaction records if past bank statements are not available; (c) whether all affected parents have been notified of the unauthorised withdrawals from their CDA accounts; (d) how often are CDA accounts audited; and (e) whether these accounts are subject to audit by the Auditor-General's Office.
- \*6. Ms Irene Ng Phek Hoong: To ask the Minister for Social and Family Development (a) what are the safeguards put in place to prevent elder abuse and neglect from becoming more prevalent as our society ages and the pace of life becomes faster; (b) whether existing measures can be strengthened; and (c) what role can neighbours and the larger community play in looking out for the welfare of vulnerable seniors and reporting abuse cases.
- \*7. Mr Baey Yam Keng: To ask the Minister for Culture, Community and Youth (a) what is the Government's commitment to maintain the status of the Singapore Botanic Gardens as a UNESCO World Heritage Site; and (b) how can the public play a role in this process.
- \*8. Mr Zaqy Mohamad: To ask the Minister for Manpower over the past five years (a) what is the trend in the number of cases relating to race- and language-related discrimination in the work place; and (b) how many of such cases in respect of job interviews, hiring practices and workplace practices have been enforced.
- \*9. Mr Zainal Sapari: To ask the Minister for Manpower (a) whether the Tripartite Alliance for Fair Employment Practices (TAFEP) has been effective in reducing discrimination at workplaces; (b) whether the existing framework of measures are sufficient to send a strong message that workplace discrimination, particularly those related to race and religion, will not be tolerated; and (c) what recourse can an individual take should the person feel that there is discrimination due to race and religion.
- \*10. **Dr Chia Shi-Lu:** To ask the Minister for Education whether the Ministry will consider requiring all schools and educational institutions organising overseas trips for students and staff to purchase travel insurance which cover medical evacuation or treatment for pre-existing conditions.

\*11. Mr Hri Kumar Nair: To ask the Minister for Education what is the rationale for excluding students in Specialised Independent Schools who are suffering from dyslexia from receiving subsidies to participate in the dyslexia remediation programme conducted by the Dyslexia Association of Singapore and whether the Ministry will review that policy.

- \*12. Ms Kuik Shiao-Yin: To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources (a) aside from rental controls, what are NEA's plans to help hawkers deal with the more significant cost drivers of ingredients and manpower; (b) how the setting of distinctly different price caps for local and western hawker cuisine preserves local hawker heritage; (c) whether NEA, with the Ministry for Social and Family Development, can issue more targeted concessions for low-income individuals to keep food affordable for the truly needful rather than use price caps that benefit those who can afford the full price; and (d) how does NEA ensure that the social enterprises managing the hawker centres do not take advantage of their position to profiteer unfairly.
- \*13. Ms Chia Yong Yong: To ask the Prime Minister (a) what are the Civil Service guidelines in determining when retirees should be employed and when they should be engaged as independent contractors for services; and (b) whether retirees should be employed on a part-time basis to enjoy employment benefits instead of being engaged as independent contractors.
- \*14. Mr Baey Yam Keng: To ask the Minister for Health (a) what is the current number and percentage of CPF members who have reached their Medisave contribution ceiling; and (b) whether the Ministry can allow CPF members, upon reaching their Medisave contribution ceilings, to keep the overflows to pay for medical expenses instead of channelling the overflows to their Special, Retirement or Ordinary Accounts.
- \*15. Mr Thomas Chua Kee Seng: To ask the Minister for Trade and Industry in respect of advance estimates that the Singapore economy grew by 1.7 per cent on a year-on-year basis in the second quarter of 2015 (a) which are the specific sectors driving this growth; and (b) to what extent have SMEs contributed to this growth.
- \*16. Mr Gan Thiam Poh: To ask the Minister for Trade and Industry (a) for the past five years, what has been the GDP per dollar of business cost in Singapore; and (b) what measures has or will the Government take to either improve the GDP or reduce the unit business cost that can improve Singapore's competitiveness and productivity drive.

- \*17. Mr Gerald Giam Yean Song: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) how an electrical insulation problem in one "third rail" cover between Tanjong Pagar and Raffles Place MRT stations can cause a catastrophic failure across the entire North-South and East-West Lines (NSEWL); (b) whether this is an indication of a lack of built-in redundancy or poor system design of the MRT's electrical network; (c) whether engineers have assessed that a massive overhaul of the NSEWL is needed to prevent such failures from recurring; and (d) if so, what it will take in terms of time, cost and system downtime for such an overhaul to be completed.
- \*18. Mr Christopher de Souza: To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs (a) what are the rehabilitative aspects of corrective training; and (b) how effective has it been in reforming individuals caught in a cycle of re-offending.
- \*19. Mr Christopher de Souza: To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs how effective has preventive detention been in reducing the recidivism rate for released persons.
- \*20. Mr Zainal Sapari: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) what is the form of assistance that is rendered by BCA to mediate disputes involving residents and developers especially in private housing projects where there are design or construction defects even though these comply with BCA's building regulations; and (b) whether BCA can tighten the issuance of the Temporary Occupation Permit or Certificate of Statutory Compliance to ensure building construction meets an acceptable standard.
- \*21. Mr Pritam Singh: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) whether NParks will review the policy of charging for car park usage at popular parks; and (b) whether it can consider a pilot scheme at Bedok Reservoir Park to allow free car park usage from 5am to 9am and 5pm to 9pm with a view to extending it to all parks, so as to incentivise the encouragement of a healthy lifestyle among all Singaporeans.
- \*22. Er Dr Lee Bee Wah: To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources in light of the Report of the Auditor-General for FY2014/15 on how NEA's contractor only treated rodent burrows found in the areas under NEA's purview (a) whether NEA will disregard these boundaries when carrying out its responsibilities that relate to public health issues; and (b) whether NEA has informed the other public agencies when the rodent burrows are discovered in these agencies' boundaries.

- \*23. Mr Baey Yam Keng: To ask the Minister for Communications and Information with reference to the recently staged Chronology On Death, whether the Ministry will consider using the same approach to give more leeway for potentially controversial performances, including plays, musicals and films, to be staged or screened on the condition that post-performance dialogues be held between the producers/directors and audiences.
- \*24. **Dr Benedict Tan:** To ask the Minister for Culture, Community and Youth whether there are any plans to introduce legislation to further prevent doping, as suggested by the World Anti-Doping Code 2015 (article 22) and the UNESCO International Convention Against Doping in Sport 2005 (article 8).
- \*25. Mr David Ong Kim Huat: To ask the Minister for National Development over the last two years, what is the number of cases which the Ministry has received involving fraudulent foreign property transactions made by licensed estate agents.
- \*26. Mr K Karthikeyan: To ask the Minister for Health whether the Ministry can consider capping hospital bills based on the class of ward that the patient is admitted to instead of capping the maximum amount that they can claim from MediShield Life.
- \*27. Mr Png Eng Huat: To ask the Minister for Education of the 7,000 foreign students at secondary and junior college levels who were granted PR status between 2001 and 2014 (a) how many of them were on scholarships or tuition grants and what was the amount of tuition grants given; and (b) how many did not complete their scholarship or tuition grant obligations.
- \*28. Mr Seah Kian Peng: To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources (a) when was the last time the price of water was increased for households and how this compares with the frequency and quantum of the rise in electricity tariffs; (b) what are the governing principles used in determining the rates for water and electricity; (c) whether the price of water is currently set on the basis of price recovery; and (d) what is the long-term marginal cost of water.
- \*29. Mr Arthur Fong: To ask the Minister for National Development whether HDB will consider (i) installing double glazed windows for the bedrooms of flats that are to be built near MRT lines, expressways or busy trunk roads leading to and from expressways; (ii) retrofitting existing bedroom casement windows to double glazed windows; and (iii) including the retrofitting programme for flats built near noisy junctions or roads with heavy traffic.

- \*30. Mr Pritam Singh: To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs whether the reservation procedure of rally sites through the police for the upcoming General Election is on a "first-come-first-served" basis as at the 2011 General Election or via balloting as at the 2012 and 2013 by-elections.
- \*31. Mr Gerald Giam Yean Song: To ask the Minister for Health in 2012, 2013 and 2014, how many eligible patients reached (i) the annual withdrawal cap of \$400 from their own Medisave accounts (not that of their family members); or (ii) the annual CHAS subsidy limits of \$320 or \$480 for simple chronic (Tier 1) or complex chronic (Tier 2) conditions respectively, for treatment of conditions under the Chronic Disease Management Programme (CDMP).
- \*32. Er Dr Lee Bee Wah: To ask the Minister for Health given that from time to time healthcare services run by public healthcare groups may revise the fees for their services (a) how many price revisions have there been in the past three years; (b) whether these institutions have to justify to the Ministry before revising such fees; (c) whether there is a standing procedure for these institutions to announce and explain such fee revisions to the public; and (d) whether the Ministry ensures that the public is adequately informed of any fee revisions instead of discovering such revisions only when they pay for their medication and treatment.
- \*33. Ms Kuik Shiao-Yin: To ask the Minister for Social and Family Development (a) whether the policy of unequal benefits between unwed and married mothers in the past decade has led to (i) a decline in serial births out of wedlock in Singapore; (ii) an increase in births within marriage in Singapore; (iii) an increase in abortions by unwed mothers; (iv) a decrease in abortions by married mothers; and (b) what other case studies and alternative options is the Ministry presently exploring that can more effectively incentivise births within marriage.
- \*34. Ms Lee Li Lian: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) what are the reasons for converting an empty piece of land in Rivervale Crescent from a secondary school development to a mix of a park and residential estate; and (b) whether this can be opened up for other types of development.
- \*35. Mr Gan Thiam Poh: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) what are the current utilisation rates of City Direct bus services and feeder bus services operated by private bus operators respectively; (b) how many buses have been provided for each route of service; and (c) whether LTA can consider increasing the number of City Direct bus services for Hougang Avenue 8, Sengkang and Punggol.

- \*36. Mr Zaqy Mohamad: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) whether there are provisions in the Government Contracting Model (GCM) for buses in 2016 to be called up for emergency bus services in the event of rail disruptions; (b) whether the bill for these emergency bus services will be passed on to the rail operators; and (c) between the various bus operators under the GCM model, whether LTA has a plan on which operators will be tapped on to operate which emergency routes in a rail disruption.
- \*37. Mr Gerald Giam Yean Song: To ask the Minister for Manpower what is the number and percentage of Employment Pass (EP) applications since the launch of the Jobs Bank that have been submitted within one week of the end of the minimum 14-day mandatory advertisement period.
- \*38. Mr Thomas Chua Kee Seng: To ask the Minister for Manpower whether the Ministry will consider stepping up initiatives to facilitate the channelling of unemployed citizens to business growth sectors that are continuing to look for manpower.
- \*39. Mr David Ong Kim Huat: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) how quarrelling tenants under HDB's Joint Singles Scheme can have their disputes settled quickly; and (b) what help is currently available for those who find it impossible to co-rent their flat.
- \*40. Mr Gan Thiam Poh: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) what is the projected number of commuters who will switch from the North East Line to Downtown Line 2 and benefit from the commencement of operation in December 2015; (b) whether Downtown Line 3 will commence earlier than scheduled; and (c) whether the Ministry will consider extending Downtown Line 3 at Tampines to Punggol, Sengkang and Ang Mo Kio.
- \*41. Assoc Prof Randolph Tan: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) how has the Bus Service Enhancement Programme (BSEP) managed the increase in demand for manpower; (b) why the tight labour market does not appear to have delayed the deployment schedule of the BSEP; and (c) what is the Ministry's plans for coping with the future manpower needs of the expanding bus transport network infrastructure.

- \*42. Ms Irene Ng Phek Hoong: To ask the Minister for Manpower (a) what is the status of the security sector's readiness to implement the Progressive Wage Model (PWM) from 1 September 2016 given the need to meet training requirements and wage levels by then; (b) whether there are measures to assist security guards who fail to meet the training requirements, to meet the new standards or to transition to another industry; and (c) what measures will be taken to ensure that service buyers will support the anticipated cost increases when tendering for new contracts or renewing existing contracts under PWM.
- \*43. Mr K Karthikeyan: To ask the Minister for Manpower whether the Ministry can bring forward the implementation of the Progressive Wage Model for landscape workers to this year.
- \*44. Mr Lim Biow Chuan: To ask the Minister for Health whether the Ministry will consider allowing Pioneer Generation patients to select their own doctors at Specialist Outpatient Clinics at public/restructured hospitals.
- \*45. **Ms Lee Li Lian:** To ask the Minister for National Development what is the time frame required to evaluate the effectiveness of the bird-deterrent gel used recently by the Choa Chu Kang Town Council to tackle pigeon issues and whether this gel will be made available to other town councils.
- \*46. Ms Lee Li Lian: To ask the Minister for Transport with the release of new BTO flats in Rivervale Delta, whether the Ministry will look into (i) providing more bus services apart from the current bus 371; and (ii) increasing the frequency of current bus service 371 to cater to the increase in demand in the area.
- \*47. Ms Irene Ng Phek Hoong: To ask the Minister for Transport whether the Ministry can provide an update on the progress of (i) the National Cycling Plan to make it even more comprehensive; (ii) the provision of a clear and consistent set of cycling rules and norms to be applied nation-wide; and (iii) the national voluntary cyclist education programme for schools, community centres and foreign worker dormitories.
- \*48. Mrs Lina Chiam: To ask the Minister for Manpower (a) whether the guidelines of the Tripartite Alliance for Fair and Progressive Employment Practices (TAFEP) are adequate to protect older workers since PMETs accounted for 51% of the layoffs last year; and (b) whether there is a need to legislate policies to safeguard the interest of these workers.

- \*49. Ms Kuik Shiao-Yin: To ask the Minister for Manpower from 2010 to 2014

  (a) what is the number of criminal cases of abuse of foreign domestic workers by employers that occurred because of mental health issues; (b) what is the number of criminal cases of abuse of employers by foreign domestic workers that occurred because of mental health issues; (c) how does the Ministry work with maid agencies and VWOs to educate employers and foreign domestic workers on mental health issues; and (d) whether the Ministry has considered making mandatory or voluntary mental health checks for both employer and domestic worker part of the hiring process.
- \*50. Mr David Ong Kim Huat: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) to date, what is the proportion of eligible flats that have completed the Home Improvement Programme (HIP); and (b) whether there are changes to the implementation date of HIP for the remaining eligible flats.
- \*51. Mrs Lina Chiam: To ask the Minister for Manpower (a) whether the Ministry will consider implementing a 360-degree feedback appraisal system as a statutory requirement under the Employment Act for all Singapore-incorporated companies; and (b) if so, whether the results can be uploaded onto the Jobs Bank for public scrutiny.

## **QUESTIONS FOR WRITTEN ANSWER**

- 1. Mrs Lina Chiam: To ask the Prime Minister (a) what is the current number of overseas Singaporeans registered as overseas voters and the percentage of these voters when computed against the total number of eligible Singaporean voters; and (b) what is the percentage of eligible overseas voters who did not cast their votes during the last General Election in 2011.
- 2. Mr Yee Jenn Jong: To ask the Prime Minister what has been the progress on financial and capital market integration in ASEAN under the ASEAN Economic Community and specifically whether Singapore will support the proposal for a Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) Growth Bank.
- 3. Mr Gerald Giam Yean Song: To ask the Prime Minister whether full-time employees of statutory boards are considered to be holders of a whole time office in the service of the Government and be disqualified from being Members of Parliament (MP) or being nominated for candidacy for election as an MP.

**4. Mr K Karthikeyan:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs what is the current number of paramedics assigned to every fire station and whether that is derived from the ratio of citizens in the vicinity.

- 5. Mr K Karthikeyan: To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs what is the permissible response time for ambulances to reach patients after receiving an emergency call.
- **6. Er Dr Lee Bee Wah:** To ask the Minister for Trade and Industry (a) what is the take-up rate for space in JTC and HDB industrial parks for the past three years; (b) whether there is more demand than supply for such space; and (c) whether there are plans to build more such parks.

Mr Gan Thiam Poh: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) in each of the past seven years to date, what is the number of first-time applicants who have been successful in securing their BTO flats; (b) how many of them have collected their keys in the past four years and how many are expected to collect their keys in 2015 and the next two years; and (c) how many of these first-timers have been successful in receiving grants for the purchase of HDB resale flats in the past seven years.
- 10. Ms Tin Pei Ling: To ask the Minister for National Development whether HDB will consider raising the quota under Married Child Priority Scheme for mature estates to encourage and better enable young couples to care for their elderly parents who are more likely to reside in mature estates.

11. Ms Tin Pei Ling: To ask the Minister for National Development whether the Ministry will exempt home owners of MacPherson Residency who are renovating their BTO flats from the mandatory pre-packed material requirement given that a great majority of them have secured their units before the rule's introduction in 2014 and not all blocks could start renovation before 1 June 2015 due to the staggered key collection dates.

- Mrs Lina Chiam: To ask the Minister for National Development (a) whether any Fukushima food products have been repackaged and sold under other local brand names in Singapore; (b) if so, what are these local brand names and in which supermarkets are these repackaged goods being sold; and (c) whether the Ministry will consider a research study on the health effects of Fukushima products on consumers.
- 13. Mr Zainal Sapari: To ask the Minister for National Development whether HDB can consider granting an area for season parking to enable NEA-licensed mobile operators who sell ice-cream, canned drinks and prepacked tit-bits to continue their livelihood and help them manage their operation cost.
- **Mr Yee Jenn Jong:** To ask the Minister for National Development what is the number of complaints the Ministry has received from flat owners over the past years per 100 units of flats completed for (i) Built-to-Order (BTO) flats and (ii) Design, Build and Sell Scheme (DBSS) flats respectively.
- 15. Mr Christopher de Souza: To ask the Minister for Defence (a) how will the Ministry increase its use of new technology to augment and modernise the SAF's existing fighting force in the next 15 years in the backdrop of emerging threats like cyber attacks; and (b) whether he can elaborate on the rollout of the doubling of SAF's mobility and motorised functions.
- 16. Mr Christopher de Souza: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) whether he can provide an update on the progress of construction of the Downtown Line 2 stations of King Albert Park, Sixth Avenue and Tan Kah Kee; and (b) whether these stations are on track to being operationalised by mid-2016.

Mr Christopher de Souza: To ask the Minister for Transport how was LTA able to expedite the completion of the Downtown Line 2 MRT stations ahead of schedule in December 2015 and make up for lost time such that the insolvency of the contractor Alpine Bau GmbH did not hamper the completion timeline.

Mr Ang Hin Kee:** To ask the Minister for Transport whether the Ministry has plans to extend the MRT networks to link Punggol directly to Yio Chu Kang and Seletar towns as these towns are currently only accessible by roads from Punggol and the population at neighbouring Sengkang has expanded.

Er Dr Lee Bee Wah: To ask the Minister for Transport (a) how many cases of passengers refusing to pay their fares and committing acts of violence have been reported by taxi drivers in the past three years; (b) whether the Ministry will consider raising the penalties against such offenders to serve as a deterrence; and (c) whether the Ministry will make it mandatory for taxi drivers to be covered by insurance against loss of income and medical treatment arising from any injury sustained in such incidents.
- 22. Ms Lee Li Lian: To ask the Minister for Social and Family Development
  (a) how do family service centres reach out to intellectually disabled individuals to help them find jobs; and (b) what is the success rate of helping them to secure jobs.
- 23. Mr Gerald Giam Yean Song: To ask the Minister for Social and Family Development (a) what is the breakdown of suicides and attempted suicides in Singapore according to age, ethnicity, sex, and monthly income for the past five years; (b) whether the Government has conducted studies on suicide in Singapore and, if so, whether such studies can be made publicly available; and (c) whether the Government has introduced any measures or programmes to address suicide in Singapore.
