“Business” Motion

The Deputy Prime Minister to move—

That, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order No. 7, at its rising today this Assembly do stand adjourned to Tuesday, the 21st of July, 1959, at 2.30 p.m.

ORDER OF THE DAY

Motion made by the Deputy Prime Minister and Question proposed—

That the following Address in reply to the speech of the Yang di-Pertuan Negara be agreed to:—

“We, the Legislative Assembly of the State of Singapore, express our thanks to the Yang di-Pertuan Negara for the speech which he delivered on behalf of the Government at the opening of the present session of this Assembly.”

Resumption of Debate on Question. (17th July, 1959).

As an amendment to be moved by Inche Mohamed Ali bin Alwi (Member for Kampong Kembangan)—

“at end, to add—

‘but regret that the speech did not in principle clarify the special position of the Malays who are recognised as the indigenous people of the Island of Singapore.’”
