QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER

- *1. Mr. Poh Ber Liak: To ask the Deputy Prime Minister whether the Government intends to establish a pedestrian crossing at 7th mile Tampines Road, near the market and when.
 - *2. Mr. Poh Ber Liak: To ask the Minister for Education whether the Government intends to give any assistance to Peng Ghee High School for development, and if he will give details.
 - *3. Mr. Ng Yeow Chong: To ask the Minister for Health whether the Government has any plan to build a medium-sized market to replace the present covered pitches at the Tanjong Rhu Estate to serve the residents in the area.
 - *4. Mr. Ng Yeow Chong: To ask the Minister for Health whether the Government will provide electricity and water supplies in the covered pitches in the Kallang and the Tanjong Rhu Estates, particularly for the night pitch-holders.
 - *5. Mr. Ong Lian Teng: To ask the Minister for Culture and Social Affairs (a) the total number of employees involved in the publication of the *Malaysian Mirror*; (b) the amount of money spent on each issue; and (c) the Head and subhead of the 1965 Estimates which provides for the expenditure.
 - *6. Mr. Chia Thye Poh: To ask the Minister for Law and National Development the reason for dissolving the Nanyang University Co-operative Store.
 - *7. Mr. Ng Kah Ting: To ask the Minister for Law and National Development whether and when the Government will improve the anchorage facilities for fishing boats near the jetty at the end of Upper Serangoon Road.
 - *8. Mr. Ng Kah Ting: To ask the Minister for Law and National Development whether and when the Government will introduce legislation to legalise trawling.

FOREIGN POLICY: That this House urges the Singapore Government to adopt a foreign policy friendly to Afro-Asian countries, and to resume trade immediately with Indonesia; to get rid of foreign bases which allow Singapore to be drifted into the aggressive war against the newly emerging countries, and to stand with the Afro-Asian people to support the Vietnamese people in their struggle against United States military intervention.
