QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER

- *1. **Er Dr Lee Bee Wah:** To ask the Minister for Transport whether taxi drivers aged 65 and above who have taken their medical assessments for their personal driving licence may be exempted from retaking the same tests for their vocational licence within the same year.
- *2. **Er Dr Lee Bee Wah:** To ask the Minister for Home Affairs (a) in the past year, how many people have been penalised for jaywalking; (b) how does the Ministry monitor areas where jaywalking is prevalent; (c) how many fatal traffic accidents were caused by jaywalking in the past three years; (d) whether the Ministry plans to implement additional measures to reduce the danger of fatal traffic accidents to the elderly who jaywalk; and (e) whether there is a need to review the current penalties to deter jaywalking.
- *3. **Mr Louis Ng Kok Kwang:** To ask the Prime Minister whether the Government will consider increasing the period during which Government-Paid Paternity Leave may be consumed from within 12 months of childbirth to within 24 months of childbirth.

1. **Mr Louis Ng Kok Kwang:** To ask the Minister for Transport for each year in the past three years (a) what are the numbers of registered (i) electric cars (ii) hybrid cars and (ii) petrol cars; (b) for each of the three categories of registered cars, how many are (i) between 600 cc to 1,000 cc (ii) 1,000 cc to 1,600 cc and (iii) 1,600 cc to 3,000 cc; and (c) whether the Ministry will start collecting such data if it does not currently do so.

 2. **Mr Louis Ng Kok Kwang:** To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources (a) for each month from 1 January 2018, how many cars have been registered under the Vehicle Emission Schemes in the A1, A2, B, C1 and C2 bands respectively; and (b) whether the Ministry will start collecting such data if it does not currently do so.
